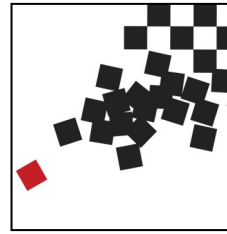

Tickets are £75 and are strictly limited on a first-come first-served basis. Please let me know if you would like to attend by 22 March.

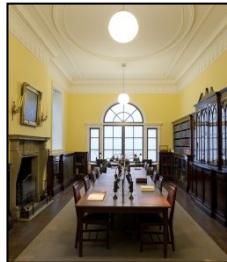

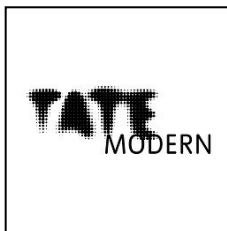
