



The London Library Legacy Flash Fiction Prize 2021 Eligibility Criteria and Guidelines

Thank you for your interest in entering The London Library Legacy Flash Fiction Prize 2021.

These guidelines will help you to understand the process for entering the competition. Please read the eligibility criteria and submission guidelines carefully before sending your entry. If you have any questions about the prize, please email flashfiction@londonlibrary.co.uk.

Eligibility

1. The London Library Legacy Flash Fiction Prize is open to all current members of The London Library.
2. Remote Access, Associate, Young and Supported members are eligible to enter.
3. Members whose subscriptions have lapsed are not eligible to enter.
4. Staff and trustees of The London Library are not eligible to entries.

Entries must be submitted in accordance with the submission guidelines. We reserve the right to disqualify any submissions that do not comply fully.

Selection

1. All entries will be anonymised before they are received by the judge.
2. The winning entry will be determined on merit by Library trustee Daisy Goodwin, who is sponsoring and judging the competition.

Submissions

1. To enter for the prize, you must email your entry to flashfiction@londonlibrary.co.uk by 11am on Friday 12 November. You will not be able to submit an entry after the deadline.
2. You will receive immediate automated email confirmation that we have received your submission.
3. When submitting your entry, you must place your name and six-word story in the body of the email. Please do not submit your entry in an attachment.
4. Your entry must not exceed six words (including prepositions and conjunctions). Any stories that exceed the word count will not be considered and your entry will be void.
5. Entries must be on the theme of 'How you want to be remembered'.
6. We will only accept one entry per member.
7. The winning entry and a runners up shortlist will be published, along with their authors' names, in the Library's December newsletter, on social media and in the next issue of the Library magazine. By entering the competition, you agree that the

Library may publish your name and entry in the event that it is shortlisted or selected for the prize. Entries that are not selected will be destroyed after the competition.

8. The winner will be notified in December 2021.
9. The winning entry will be announced in the Library's December newsletter and on social media.
10. Incomplete entries or entries which do not comply with the guidelines will not be eligible.
